

**Remuneration for road transport sector drivers (Freight transport)**

<b>Greece</b>	<p>Since 1.5.2022, the statutory minimum salary and minimum wage for full-time employment for white and blue collar workers throughout Greece are set as follows (Ministerial Decision No. 38866/21.4.2022, Government Gazette B ' 2030):</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. For white collar workers, the minimum salary is set at 713,00 €.</li><li>2.
